OSHA Extends Some Compliance Dates for Beryllium Standard

OSHA is extending the compliance date for specific ancillary requirements of the general industry beryllium standard to Dec. 12, 2018.

This extension affects provisions for methods of compliance, beryllium work areas, regulated areas, personal protective clothing and equipment, hygiene facilities and practices, housekeeping, communication of hazards and recordkeeping. The extension does not affect the compliance dates for other requirements of the general industry beryllium standard.

ASSP Asks OSHA to Raise Awareness of Fall Protection Management Programs

ASSP recently sent a letter to OSHA asking the agency to more strongly emphasize the need for comprehensive fall protection management programs in industry. The Society notes that while fall protection is a specific topic within OSH management system standards such as ANSI/ASSP Z10 and ISO 45001, more must be done to improve fall protection management.

The fourth insight is: Culture Sustains Performance – For Better or For Worse

Krause states that "Leadership affects culture, and culture amplifies everything. The fourth insight is about the role culture plays in safety and organizational performance generally. It explains the very interesting relationships between leadership and culture, and implications for the long-term future of the organization."
